Dear Councilmember Cedillo, Mr. Moshkar and Captain Jeffrey Burt:

A number of neighbors and stakeholders have voiced concerns about speeding on residential streets and in combined business and residential districts throughout Glassell Park.

We have identified the following locations that have become speeding corridors:

Moss Ave from Yorkshire to W. Ave 33
Yorkshire Drive from Lavell to Moss Ave
Kinney Street from El Rosa to W Ave 35
Rome Drive as a shortcut from Cazador to Division
Cazador Street from Brilliant to Brilliant to Rome Drive.
Rome Drive from Division to Wollam St.
Division Street from W Ave 30 to Rome

In addition to speeding concerns, there are also concerns about stop signs being ignored, specifically at Rome and Cazador and at Yorkshire/Parrish/Lavell's 3-way stop.

We request heightened traffic enforcement. In addition, we would like to schedule a meeting with LADOT to discuss speed humps, raised dots or other options that would be suitable to each unique location and would permanently reduce the speed of traffic.

Many of the streets in Glassell Park are without sidewalks, railings or berms; some are at a steep grade, and many are very narrow with blind curves. Quite a few are "all of the above".

When delivery & construction trucks, as well as neighbors, workers and guests speed through the neighborhood in vehicles of all sizes and ignore stop signs, it's a public safety concern, and it takes away from the walkability and enjoyment of our neighborhood.
